Tradition and zeitgeist in harmony

The Park-Hotel Egerner Höfe combines alpine living culture with modern furniture by MBM

"Just open your eyes, everything is beautiful." Ludwig Thoma would certainly have included the Park-Hotel Egerner Höfe on the southern shore of lake Tegernsee in his enthusiasm, if he had stayed in the 5-star superior hotel in Rottach-Egern back then. In every corner of the privately run hotel resort, the guest discovers appealing furnishing details. 117 rooms and suites are designed with plenty alpine allure and a flair for the contemporary. The modern aspect of the furnishing is particularly evident with the furniture of Münchener Boulevard Möbel GmbH, MBM.

The Bavarian Alpine mountains close by, red geraniums on rustic balconies, the canopy of the entrance area covered with wooden shingles and the windows decorated with wooden shutters and pretty frescoes. Behind the hotel's own park, cows graze peacefully on the adjacent pasture.

Already from the outside, the 5-star superior Hotel Egerner Höfe exudes that amiable, alpine charm that could not fit better into the old Bavarian culture of the Tegernsee valley. The Park Hotel with its 220 beds has been one of the top addresses in Upper Bavaria since 1992. While the facade of the house reveals the affinity to tradition, only at second glance does it become apparent that the modern spirit, the zeitgeist, is also present in the Egerner Höfe. Yes, one would like to say: Modern spirit plays a major role here.

This liaison of tradition and zeitgeist can be felt in all areas of the hotel: in the kitchen, where regional deli food and international gourmet art coexist, as well as in the interior design of the house. Here, tiled stoves, chandeliers and old Bavarian antiques meet modern and exquisite furniture. Down-to-earth hospitality at the highest level, that's how you could describe this beneficial mixture.

MBM makes use of colors

Traditional living culture is reinterpreted in the Egerner Höfe. The basis is wood, which is used in large quantities. "Wood plays a very central role in giving the guest the feeling of disengagement and inner peace," explains hotel director Maximilian Manzenrieder. More than ten different types of wood were processed and left in a very natural state in order to feature structure and liveliness. Glass was also often employed in architecture, for example in the wide window front in Salett'l. Above all, however, the contemporary furniture, which add young and lively accents in all places of the Egerner Höfe, creates a surprise effect. Even from the outside, touches of color on the alpine wooden balconies are noticeable. MBM furniture add lively colors and emphasize the modern spirit.

All balconies and terraces of the rooms and suites are equipped with furniture of the Munich manufacturer. "The design of MBM furniture represents the zeitgeist. We deliberately wanted color effects," explains Manzenrieder, knowing that MBM suits a traditional as well as a modern style building. Two restaurant terraces are also equipped with MBM furniture. In combination with large, apple-green parasols, the furniture creates a relaxing atmosphere. The color of the umbrellas is reflected by comfortable loungers in the park, which act as eye-catchers and invitation to relax. Here, as well as in the spa area, guests can relax on Münchener Boulevard Möbel.

Inspiring shapes and functionality

Years ago, the Park Hotel purchased its first outdoor furniture from MBM and since then has repeatedly furnished new areas with chairs, tables or loungers from the Munich manufacturer. "We are enthusiastic about the furniture because it looks very

appealing. When it comes to design, MBM always stands at the forefront. At the same time, the furniture features very good properties in use," emphasizes Manzenrieder. The Munich furniture manufacturers have a distinct sense of modern design language. At the same time, the furniture is particularly suitable for use in hotels, restaurants or spa facilities due to its functionality and durability. "Here, the furniture is used every day and therefore has to withstand a lot of strain. It is important for us that the loungers are easy to care for and easy to wash off. The pads have to be robust and easy to remove," the hotel manager summarizes the key criteria.

Everybody and everything for the guest

Hotel owner Klaus-Dieter Oechner Graf von Moltke and director Maximilian Manzenrieder proclaimed the philosophy from the very beginning: "Everyone and everything for the guest." "The most important ambition for us is to welcome every guest with love. He should feel at home – or rather: he should feel even better with us, because we want to anticipate all his wishes," emphasizes Manzenrieder. Around 135 employees, including 15 to 20 trainees, are responsible for these and other tasks on the approximately 17,000 square meter hotel area of the Egerner Höfe.

Four restaurants between regional and international cuisine

Creative chef Achim Hack, supported by Matthias Beck, takes care of the physical well-being in the four restaurants. Tradition and modern spirit also meet in culinary terms. The poet's parlor is a gourmet restaurant decorated, among other awards, with a Michelin star. The ambiance in the poet's parlor is typically old Bavarian: wooden floors, ceilings and walls, tiled stove and corner seat - Bavarian heart, what more could you ask for? And a lordly league of Bavarian poets greets the guest from the walls. Under the watchful eye of Ludwig Thoma and his colleagues, dishes based on regionally authentic recipes and surprisingly reinterpreted in culinary terms are served.

The Hubertusstüberl with its savory regional dishes of the highest quality represents the tradition of fine, old Bavarian inns. In the Egerner-Alm-Stadl the guest is spoiled with Bavarian delicacies of grandmother's times.

On the other hand, the zeitgeist catches up with gourmets in the St. Florian restaurant and the Salett'l: Culinary gourmet food of the cross-over cuisine with international and vegetarian ideas is served here. But no matter what the guest decides for - Ludwig Thoma would have advised: "Just open your mouth, everything is delicious."
